- By the authority vested in me as President of the United States by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, it is hereby ordered as follows:

- Section 1. Purpose The Constitution of the United States guarantees fundamental rights and freedoms to all citizens, which cannot be infringed upon by any state. Louisiana has consistently violated federal rights, including the rights to a fair trial, equal protection under the law, and the right to vote, among other civil liberties. The state's legal and governmental systems have engaged in practices that disproportionately harm marginalized communities, foster systemic discrimination, and undermine the rule of law. The persistence of these violations requires immediate federal

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21. (b) The powers and responsibilities of the Louisiana state government including the legislative, executive, and judicial branches, are hereby suspended pending federal review.

23. (c) Federal oversight will be imposed on all legal, judicial, and governmental operations within the boundaries of Louisiana to ensure compliance with constitutional protections, civil liberties, and federal law.

25. Section 4. Establishment of a Federal Transitional Authority (a) A Federal Transitional Authority for Louisiana (FTAL) shall be established to oversee the transition to a new legal and governmental framework that complies with the U.S. Constitution.

27. (b) The FTAL will be composed of federal officials appointed by the President, including representatives from the Department of Justice, the Department of Homeland Security, and civil rights experts. This body will work in conjunction with the federal judiciary and the U.S. Congress to create a fair and equitable legal system for the people of Louisiana.

29. (c) The FTAL will have the authority to draft and implement a new constitution for the State of Louisiana, subject to federal approval, that ensures the protection of civil rights, equal justice under the law, and democratic governance.

31. Section 5. Protection of Civil Rights and Legal Processes (a) All individuals currently residing in Louisiana shall be protected under federal law, and their civil rights as U.S. citizens shall be guaranteed.

33. (b) All criminal and civil cases previously adjudicated under unconstitutional Louisiana

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adjudicated under unconstitutional Louisiana law. Those affected by (non-unanimous) jury verdicts, shall be subject to review. The Department of Justice is instructed to reexamine convictions and sentences that were the result of unconstitutional legal processes.

35. (c) All individuals disenfranchised by Louisiana's felony disenfranchisement laws shall immediately have their voting rights restored, subject to federal oversight.

37. Section 6. Federal Oversight of Law Enforcement and Judicial Systems (a) Federal oversight shall be imposed on all law enforcement agencies within the State of Louisiana to ensure compliance with federal civil rights standards. Any officers or officials found to have violated these standards will be subject to federal prosecution.

39. (b) Federal oversight shall extend to the judicial system of Louisiana, ensuring that judges and prosecutors adhere to constitutional guidelines and do not engage in discriminatory practices.

40.

41. Section 7. Implementation and Enforcement (a) The Department of Justice, in conjunction with the Department of Homeland Security, is tasked with enforcing this Executive Order and ensuring that all federal laws and constitutional protections are upheld in the State of Louisiana.

43. (b) The FTAL shall provide a comprehensive plan for restructuring Louisiana's governmental and legal systems within 180 days of this order, to be reviewed and approved by Congress and the President.

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45. Section 8. Duration of Federal Oversight (a) Federal oversight and governance of Louisiana shall remain in place until such time that a new state government and legal framework, compliant with federal law and constitutional protections, is fully established and operational.

47. Section 9. Severability If any provision of this Executive Order is found to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

49. Section 10. Effective Date This Executive Order is effective immediately upon signing.
